Dear families,

We welcome you and your child to Kindergarten! We hope we have a wonderful year together. Your child will be in a multi-aged K-3 classroom with either Ms. Pollick or Ms. Leathwood. The benefits of multi-age are that students learn a variety of skills that support them to be resilient, independent, good leaders, better citizens as well as learning patience, acceptance and understanding.

Both of us have a passion for teaching primary and are so excited to be your child's first school teacher! We look forward to your involvement in our classrooms and in your child's learning.

In September, there will be a gradual entry into Kindergarten. Please have a look at the gradual entry schedule below. We really appreciate your flexibility as we help all children get off to the best start possible in school.

The first year of school should be one of excitement, enjoyment, and learning. We would like to invite you to a 'meet the teacher orientation' for parents and guardians on **Wednesday**, **September 21st at 3:15**. During this meeting we will introduce our classroom routines and learning intentions for the year, tell you all about ourselves, and go over a few helpful notes and any questions you may have about the coming year. Please mark it in your calendars, I know it is a long way off!

Parents often wonder how they can help prepare their child for Kindergarten. Here are some ways:

- Play games that involve numbers. Any game with dice or a spinner would give your child the opportunity to recognize numbers and practice counting while having fun!
- Practice holding pencils, crayons and scissors correctly and developing fine motor skills. If your child hasn't shown an interest in learning letters or numbers yet, don't worry! They will learn them at school. (here is a good site to help with pencil grip: https://www.grow-inghandsonkids.com/pencil-grasp-development-for-writing.html)
- Help your child talk about and label their feelings. Socio-emotional learning and self-regulation are a huge part of learning and sharing in a classroom setting and essential life skills!
- Help your child become as independent as possible taking off and putting on their shoes, doing up zippers, cleaning up after themselves, washing and drying their hands.



- READ, READ, READ!!!
- Enjoy talking and listening together! Oral language is a big part of our program. Talking with your child builds their vocabulary and develops their confidence in sharing their thoughts and ideas with others.
- Have a look at our Welcome to Kindergarten social story on our school website. Review this with your child as often as needed to get them excited and ready for school.
